2.1. Teaching Reading and Speaking

2.1.1. Objectives:

Objective 1: Helping learners develop their Reading Comprehension Skills

- Understanding Pictures and Headings: Teach students how to analyse pictures and headings in a text to gain a preliminary understanding of the topic or theme. Emphasise the importance of using visual cues to make predictions about the content.

- Making Inferences: Guide students on how to infer information from the reading passage. Explain that they should read between the lines to understand implied details and draw conclusions based on the information provided.

- Skimming: Introduce the concept of skimming, where students read quickly to get a general sense of the text. Teach them to focus on headings, subheadings, and the first and last sentences of paragraphs to grasp the main ideas.

- Scanning: Teach students how to scan a text to locate specific information or details quickly. Encourage them to look for keywords or phrases that are relevant to their reading objectives.

Objective 2: Improving learner's reading Fluency and Vocabulary

- Reading Aloud: Encourage students to practise reading passages aloud. This helps improve pronunciation and fluency. Additionally, it allows the teacher to provide feedback on pronunciation and intonation.

- Vocabulary Building: Introduce new vocabulary words from the reading passages. Teach students to identify and understand the meaning of these words in context. Provide practice exercises and discussions to reinforce vocabulary retention.

- Contextual Usage: Encourage students to use newly learned vocabulary words in their own sentences. This reinforces their understanding and ability to use these words in real-life situations.

- Word Banks: Create word banks or vocabulary lists related to the reading materials. Ask students to maintain personal word banks to track and review new vocabulary they encounter during reading assignments.

The focus on comprehension, inference, fluency, and vocabulary development will help students become more proficient readers.
